Rules

- 1) Each boat will be inspected by tournament officials prior to the start of the tournament. Officials may, at any time, board and inspect any boat in spot check fashion to ensure integrity of the tournament.
- 2) Fishing live-wells are mandatory. A large cooler with aerators will suffice. Absolutely no fish stringers.
- 3) **Trickle start: (5 boats at a time) Tournament time will be 7:30 am to 3:30 pm.**
- 4) Each boat must have its numbered identifier affixed at all times in an obvious place.
- 5) A minimum size of **41cm** will be in effect. If a fish less than minimum amount is brought to spotters for measuring, a **penalty of 10 pts** off final amount will be given.
- 6) Points will be calculated on the basis of 1 point per cm to a resolution of 1mm. (1 decimal pt)
- 7) All fish deemed eligible for live release by tournament officials will receive a 10 pt bonus.
- 8) Fish will be measured from the tip of the nose to the longest tip of the tail. Any competitor that attempts to fool the measuring process will be disqualified.
- 9) No lines in the water during measuring or live release.
- 10) **Six (6)** released pike may be entered by any team during the course of the tournament. A team's score will be determined by adding together the team's **5 best entries**.
- 11) Dead fish rule applies. Any fish that cannot be successfully released automatically counts as one of that team's **5** fish.
- 12) No fish other than pike may be retained by competitors with the exception of damaged fish. All damaged fish (in season) must be kept alive and turned over to tournament officials.
- 13) No live, preserved or prepared natural bait is allowed with the exception of pork rind and scent.
- 14) **All federal and provincial fisheries and boating regulations must be observed and will be enforced at all times.**
- 15) Pre-fishing allowed until 5:00 pm the **Wednesday** of the event.
- 16) No person other than the actual competitor shall be in any competing boat.
- 17) All boats must maintain at least 100' separation from other boats and shore.

18) Boat tags must be turned over to officials when done fishing. Any team which does not hand in their tag at the end of fishing hours **will be disqualified.**

19) Life-jackets must be worn by competitors when travelling at more than trolling speed.
20) No alcohol may be consumed during the tournament hours or be in any competitor's boat.

21) Ties will be solved by the team with the largest fish. Still being tied, the second biggest fish (& so forth) will determine the winner.

22) All boats must be within 200' of check-in station before 3:30 pm and **not fishing.**

Penalty: 10 pts per minute.

23) **For this tournament**, six (6) pike may be entered by any team. Of those six pike, your team can **count no more than 4** (four) pike greater than 61cm (24") of which not more than **2 (two) can be greater than 86 cm (33.9")**. Competitors may be disqualified for any violations of the rules and will not receive a refund of their entry fee. Decisions of officials are final.

Eligibility

At least one team member must be 19 years of age or over. A team is defined as 2 persons per boat. All anglers must have a resident sport fishing licence (unless under 18 years of age or older than 65). Non resident anglers should consult the fishing regulations for further info.

Orientation and Registration

At least one member should attend the orientation meeting on Friday, July 2nd, 2010 at the Club Âge d'Or **Azilda**, 64 Notre-Dame (983-2992). Registration begins at 7 pm.
